



Piano Services and Fees

Important: Regular tuning is key to keeping your piano stable and sounding its best. The longer a piano goes without tuning, the harder it becomes to bring it back and keep it in tune. Stability improves with consistent maintenance over time. How long a tuning lasts depends on factors like the piano's age, condition, quality, environment, time since the last tuning, and seasonal changes. For pianos that need a pitch correction, this is just the first step-follow-up tuning is typically required to properly stabilize the instrument.

Standard Tuning - \$120

This service is for pianos tuned within the past year (no more than 14 months). If it's been longer or you're unsure, (*or it is more than 20cents flat*) a pitch correction is likely needed.

Pitch Correction – \$150

Recommended for pianos that haven't been tuned in over a year (*or they are between 20 to 60cents flat*). This service brings the piano back to standard pitch (A440) and includes an initial adjustment followed by fine tuning.

Pianos that are significantly out of pitch require this process to restore proper tension. Because of the adjustment involved, a follow-up tuning is usually needed to help the instrument settle and stay in tune.

Pitch Raise Plus – \$170

Recommended for pianos that haven't been tuned in approximately 5 years or more (*or they are over 60cents flat*). Over time, the string tension drops significantly, requiring multiple passes to gradually bring the piano back up to a stable tuning level before fine tuning can be completed.

In some cases, especially with older or heavily neglected instruments, the piano may not safely reach standard pitch (A440) in a single visit, and a staged approach or lower temporary pitch may be recommended depending on condition.

A follow-up tuning is typically needed after this service, and regular maintenance should continue to help stabilize the instrument over time.
